Course Description:

Practitioners are constantly faced with how best to retain their implant restorations. This Hands-On Workshop will review the fundamentals of both screw retention and cement retention. Discussions on which may be better in different circumstances and why will be shown. Participants will have an opportunity to both cement, and clean up after, as well as torque down a restoration using a torque driver. Participants will also get a hands on opportunity to use a new memory metal nitrile sleeve to retain restorations, a screw-less and cement-less option. Models will be used to demonstrate the various options and an intra-oral induction unit will also be available for participants to use for the memory metal sleeves.

Objectives:

- 1) Discuss the importance or retrievability with implant restorations. Triage placing cemented or screw retained restorations with single versus multiple implants.
- 2) Discuss the use of abutments with screw retained and cement retained restorations.
- 3) You will learn alternatives to screw and cement retained restorations.
